

Remarks of Under Secretary of the Interior John A. Carver, Jr., to the Utah Woolgrowers Association, Salt Lake City, Utah, January 9, 1965

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Utah Woolgrowers Association: It is a gratifying experience to be warmly greeted by old friends. I have come to know many of you well over the past four years, and I have enjoyed the association tremendously. Last December 30, hardly two weeks ago, I left my post as Assistant Secretary for Public Land Management to accept President Johnson's appointment as Under Secretary of the Interior. This is my first public statement in my new role. I hope you will indulge my using part of our time today to review some of my experiences over the past four years in the field of public land law administration, and to guess with you as to what the future holds.
