AFFIDAVIT OF WARD CHURCHILL	

I, Ward Churchill, swear that the following is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and information:

1. My name is Ward Churchill. I am over the age of twenty-one and I am otherwise competent to testify. I make the following statements based upon my personal knowledge.
2. The primary goal for my litigation against the University of Colorado has always been a jury determination supporting my contention that my constitutional rights were violated by the University's firing of me, and reinstatement of my employment as a professor at the University. This main goal of the litigation has never been about compensation for financial loss.
3. Another crucial purpose of my litigation against the University of Colorado was to protect the legacy of my thirty years of academic scholarship. My academic scholarship was possibly irreparably tarnished due to the University's false accusations of academic misconduct. The jury verdict in my favor, finding that the University fired me in retaliation for the exercise of my constitutionally protected rights of free speech, and that the University would not have fired me but for this speech, fully vindicated me and my scholarship and conduct.
4. Reinstatement of my employment will critically contribute to the additional restoration of the public's confidence in the integrity of my academic scholarship. Reinstatement will undo the possible negative perceptions of those who believe my entire scholarship, after my unlawful termination, is nothing more than "a pitcher of warm spit," in the words of one of the University's witnesses.
5. Finally, reinstatement of my employment will immeasurably restore the integrity of my lost reputation amongst my academic peers. No amount of financial compensation could restore my reputation as effectively as compared to reinstatement of employment to a fully tenured professor.
6. Based upon statements I heard in the media after the trial, the jurors awarded me \$1.00 because my attorneys correctly informed the jury that I was not seeking financial damages. The
