



IMMIGRATION REFORM: ARIZONA SB1070 AND BEYOND

On September 7, 2010, ACS's Colorado Lawyer Chapter, in conjunction with the Colorado Hispanic Bar Association, will host a panel discussion at the University of Denver Sturm College of Law entitled "Immigration Reform: Arizona SB1070 and Beyond."
