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### TEACHING EXPERIENCE

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*At the University of Denver, Sturm College of Law, Denver, CO:*

**Lawyering Process Professor** ■ 2003 – present ; **Director**, 2008 - present

Lawyering Process ■ I teach one section of first-year students the introduction to legal method and expression, which includes legal analysis, research and writing, and oral argument. I select the text and develop my own syllabus; I do all lectures and grading.

As the Director of the Lawyering Process Program, I coordinate a group of eight LP Professors to deliver this course to the entire first year class. Our group closely cooperates with each other, and we have a formal mentoring program for new hires.

Discovery Practicum ■ I teach one section of upper-class students a 3-credit course focused on the discovery period in litigation. In the context of a pending litigation, students prepare 13 different written discovery documents, conduct a deposition, and ultimately settle the case. I developed the course and conduct all lectures and grading.

Administrative Law ■ I occasionally teach this upper-level required course in the law of the administrative state. I selected the text and developed the syllabus. I incorporate advanced classroom technology in this class, including using a student response system (“clickers”) and group projects using Wiki software.

Emerging Trends in Data and Knowledge Management ■ In the spring semester, I have taught this course in the MSLA program in a fully online environment. This course introduces students to the theories of knowledge management and applies them to the legal environment. I selected the text, developed the syllabus, and also use a live classroom technology where all students were able to hear me, and speak to each other.

Lawyering Process ■ In addition to teaching this course as an Adjunct, I assisted the director, Prof. John Reese, in implementing changes to the program. In the last two years, I gave several of the lectures that brought all of the first year students together.

Litigation Practicum ■ This upper-level course addressed the discovery process in a practice-focused setting. I developed the syllabus and did all lectures and grading.

Legal Research and Writing ■ I taught 32 students the full year legal research and writing course, including all syllabus and lecture development, and all grading.
