



# Corporate & Commercial Law Program (CCLP) CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

Minimum Credit Requirement: 26  
GPA Requirement: Must be in good standing

## TO QUALIFY STUDENTS MUST:

1. Complete the following two (2) core courses:
  - Corporations (L4190)
  - Accounting for Lawyers (L4006)  
Or can substitute relevant course for Accounting for Lawyers with the approval of the Faculty Director based on prior education and/or experience.
2. Complete two (2) of the following courses:
  - Agency, Partnership, and LLCs (L4048)
  - Bankruptcy (L4090)
  - Secured Transactions (L4530)
  - Securities Law (L4528)
  - Trial Practice I: Basic Courtroom Skills (L4635, preferred section for CCLP students)
3. Complete an experiential learning opportunity through one (1) of the following options:
  - Option 1 – (1) Complete a Critical Thinking Seminar (link available below); (2) Complete an approved Corporate & Commercial Law Program Upper Level Writing Requirement course (link available below); and (3) Complete an approved Externship emphasizing CCL. (please see **CCLP Courses Listing**)
  - Option 2 – Complete the full year (12 credits) Community Economic Development Clinic (L4835) and Community Economic Development Clinic Seminar (L4836)
4. Complete at least one (1) additional Business Law course (from list above or at the link below) of not less than 2 credit hours. (Note: Some students may need to take additional courses to fulfill the 26 credit hour minimum requirement of the CCLP certificate). (please see **CCLP Courses Listing**)
