**George W. (“Rock”) Pring** is a Professor of Law Emeritus, University of Denver Sturm College of Law in Denver, Colorado, USA, where he has taught Environmental Law, International Environmental Law, Water Law, International Water Law, Public Land and Resources Law, Constitutional Law, and Administrative Law. Before teaching, he was in private practice in litigation and public finance with a national law firm; government service as Chief of Environmental Litigation for the State of Ohio Attorney General’s Office; and public-interest advocacy law with the international NGO Environmental Defense Fund. He is also a government and civil society advisor and lecturer, and principal in Global Environmental Outcomes LLC (GEO), an international consulting service.

Rock specializes in environment and natural resources issues nationally and internationally, including specialized Environmental Courts and Tribunals (ECTs), access to environmental justice, sustainable development, human rights, corporate social responsibility, environmental impact assessment and compliance, green building, land use planning, and nature preservation. He is a frequent speaker at universities, conferences, and capacity-building sessions in the US and abroad. He has co-authored the two pioneering works in the ECT field – Environmental Courts & Tribunals: A Guide for Policy Makers (UN Environment Programme 2016) and Greening Justice: Creating and Improving Environmental Courts and Tribunals (World Resources Institute 2009) – and International Environmental Law & Policy for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (2d ed.), Human Rights in Natural Resources Development (Oxford); contributed to the Encyclopedia of Public International Law (Oxford) and the Mineral Law & Policy Compendium; author of studies for US and foreign governments; and numerous other publications.

He and his wife are the Co-Directors of the University of Denver Environmental Courts and Tribunals (ECT) Study ([www.law.du.edu/ect-study](http://www.law.du.edu/ect-study)), the pioneering study of ECTs worldwide.

He is also an expert in constitutional and human rights issues. He co-authored SLAPPs: Getting Sued for Speaking Out, which named and drew international attention to “Strategic Lawsuits Against Public Participation” in government (“SLAPPs”) – lawsuits to chill citizens’ communications with their government officials – and has written broadly on other constitutional issues.

Rock has served as US Representative on the Academic Advisory Group for the International Bar Association’s Section on Energy, Environment, and Resources Law, Chair of the State of Colorado Hazardous Waste Commission, Adjunct Professor in Environmental Science and

Engineering at the Colorado School of Mines, Chair of the Board of Trustees of Galen University in Belize, C.A., and on other government advisory boards. He is a founder and Vice President for Land Conservation of Clear Creek Land Conservancy, a land trust.
