

COMMUNITY INNOVATION & EQUITY PROJECT

The Community Innovation and Equity Project (CIEP) of the Community Economic Development Clinic at the University of Denver Sturm College of Law provides free transactional legal services to small businesses, under-resourced entrepreneurs, community-based enterprises, and nonprofit organizations across Colorado. CIEP students work in three focus areas: supporting the small businesses and community organizations that strengthen the fabric of rural communities; advancing

equity in technology; and community education about the rights of small business owners and their workers in immigration enforcement actions.

CIEP welcomes applications for pro bono clients and partners in need of assistance with business law and community development legal needs. In addition to representing clients, student attorneys may also provide free community education workshops on issues related to rural community economic development and small business operations.
