Developed a legal externship program with the Northern Illinois University College of Law to provide law students with opportunities to gain hands-on experience in environmental law and rural community advocacy.

Co-founded the Illinois Coalition for Clean Air & Water (ICCAW) (formerly the Illinois Citizens for Clean Air & Water), which is a statewide coalition of small farmers, rural community groups and like-minded state and national organizations to advocate for sound policies and practices to protect the environment, human health, and rural quality of life. This coalition now has over 500 members from nearly 30 counties in Illinois.
