



## 2018 Leonard v.B. Sutton International Law Essay Winner Announced

Taylor Hannegan, a 2L in the International Legal Studies Program and co-president of the International Law Society, was selected from a competitive list of contributors seeking to win the 2018 Leonard v.B. Sutton International Law Essay competition. Hannegan's essay, "Effective Engagement of Multinational Corporations to Address Existing Inadequacies in the Enforcement of Norms against Human Trafficking and Forced Labor" was juried and selected by a panel of three judges based on originality, quality of research and clarity of style. Hannegan's essay will be published in a future volume of the Denver Journal of International Law & Policy. His award will enable him to study international law at the Hague Academy of International Law in the Netherlands this coming summer.

The competition, now in its 51<sup>st</sup> year, was initiated by Sutton, JD'41, a former Chief Justice of the Colorado Supreme Court, former Chair of the Foreign Claims Settlement Commission of the United States and a distinguished international lawyer, to encourage and reward scholarly research in international law.
