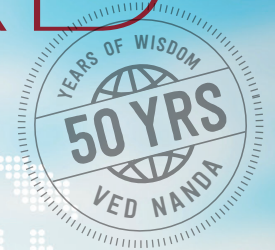

HONORING M. CHERIF BASSIOUNI

M. Cherif Bassiouni is Emeritus Professor of Law at DePaul University where he taught from 1964-2009. He was a founding member, and later served as President and Emeritus President of the International Human Rights Law Institute at DePaul University. In 1972, he was one of the founders of the International Institute of Higher Studies in Criminal Sciences (ISISC) located in Siracusa, Italy, where he served as Dean from 1974-1988 and then as President from 1988-2015. He also served as the Secretary General of the International Association of Penal Law from 1974-1989 and as President from 1989-2004. Professor Bassiouni began his education in Egypt where he obtained an LLB from the University of Cairo. He also pursued his legal education in France, Switzerland, and the United States where he earned the following degrees: J.D. Indiana University; LL.M. John Marshall Law School; and S.J.D. George Washington University.

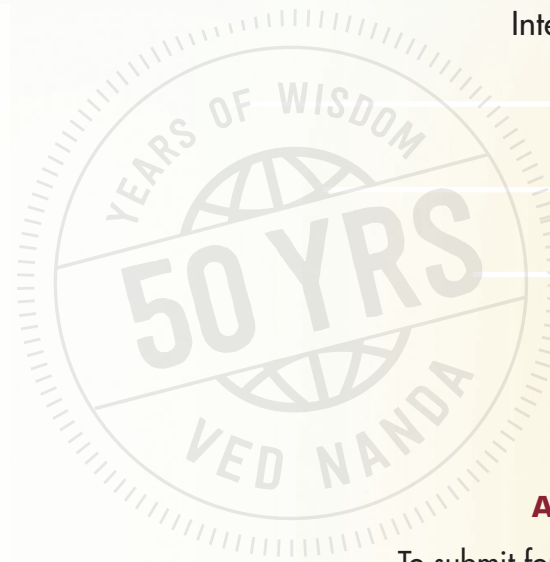
VED P. NANDA
