COLORADO'S WATER PLAN 2015 TIMELINE



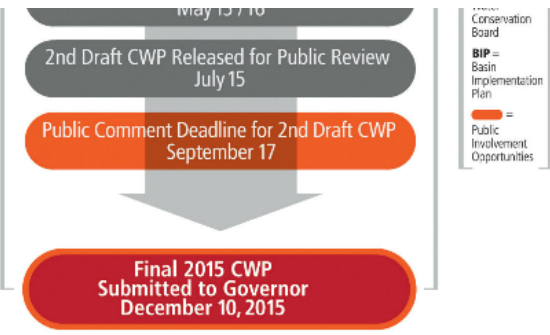

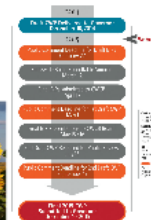
