- Coordinate regional services and activities





Housing Impacts


- Affordability

Health Care

- Increased health care costs
- Smaller professional pool to serve a growing population
- Increased disabled population
- Increased demand for home and community based services









What is the community role?

- Nationally 21% of 65+ don't drive
- Physical barriers impact older adults more than other residents
- Older adults struggle finding housing options
- Increased demand for home and community based services
- Civically and socially engaged older adults are happier and healthier





Communities for Lifelong Living

- Communities can facilitate or create barriers to successful aging
- Promote physical activity and community engagement
- Reduced burden on caregivers
- Older adults as community resources
- Age-friendly communities benefit all ages









Boomer Bond Assessment Tool

- Initially developed by group of stakeholders
 - Mobility and Access
 - Housing
 - Community Living
 - Support Services



- "Beta-tested" by 3 communities
- Tri-County Health Department worked with DRCOG to update to current version







Why an Assessment Tool?

- "Conversation starter" at the local level (including partners)
- Provide structure to what might be an otherwise overwhelming conversation




Web Tools

- Expandable, current, and locally relevant




