VULNERABILITY


What makes this population vulnerable?

Pay Now or Later



- Upwards of \$50 million spent annually
- Less to House than pay costs of MH/BH/SA, Jail and Judicial Systems
- \$18,000 vs. \$40,000






- Elephant in the room—lack of affordable, accessible housing
- Planners play a significant role, i.e.
 comprehensive plans, integration of various plans, strategies
- Housing needs, priorities addressing special and vulnerable populations must be addressed

- Legislative Actions
