FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE

Scholarships: All scholarship aid awarded by Denver Law is merit-based. We do not award need-based grants. Scholarships range from \$24,000 to full-tuition for full-time students and \$18,000 to full-tuition for part-time students and are renewable provided you maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA. All students are automatically considered for most merit aid. Scholarships are awarded on a rolling basis until funds are exhausted, so apply early to ensure that funds are available.

Chancellor's Scholarship: The Chancellor's Scholarship is the one scholarship for which you must apply. This full-tuition scholarship is awarded to students with a history of excellence in academics and public service who intend to pursue public interest law careers. To be considered, you must apply on our website by January 17th.

Federal Financial Aid: Federal grant aid is not available to law students. Nearly all federal aid that is awarded is in the form of federal loans. To be considered for federal aid, you must file the FAFSA annually at www. studentaid.gov. The priority deadline to file your FAFSA is January 15.

Military Benefits/Yellow Ribbon Program: For those utilizing Chapter 33 Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits with 100% eligibility, the Sturm College of Law, the University of Denver, and the VA will cover tuition costs over the GI Bill tuition and fees cap each academic year, making us a fully-funded Yellow Ribbon institution. There is no application for the Yellow Ribbon program. It is an automatic benefit for those who qualify. ⁴An origination fee is deducted from all disbursements of Direct Unsubsidized (1.057% fee) and Graduate PLUS Loans (4.228% fee). The amount above is the average fee paid by students borrowing an Unsubsidized Loan. Actual fees will vary based on amount borrowed.
