



REQUIRED PROOF OF FINANCES: 2019-2020 ACADEMIC YEAR

Master of Taxation: 12 Credit Hours Per Quarter (Total Degree is 45 Credits)

The following information includes the estimated **minimum** cost of attendance for the 2019-2020 academic year for graduate international students at the University of Denver. For visa issuance, you are required to show proof of funding for one academic year. These costs are based on the [Cost of Attendance](#) website maintained by the Office of Financial Aid. You can contact Financial Aid at finaid@du.edu with any questions related to tuition amounts.

Proof of funding for the Graduate Tax program requires enough tuition for 8 credits per term. This is the minimum number of credits per term for a student to be considered full time. Students who wish to enroll in more than 8 credits per quarter will pay more than the costs outlined on this document. Students are not required to complete their academic program in one year.

To issue the Form I-20 or Form DS-2019 for your program, the University of Denver must be able to verify that you have (at minimum) the following amount of funding:

Tuition (12 credit hours per quarter for 3 quarters/9 months*)	\$51,366
Student fees	\$354
Living expenses (room and board, personal expenses, transportation)	\$18,720
Books & Health Insurance**	\$4,176
TOTAL	\$74,586

*\$1,426 per credit hour (the Master of Taxation program is 45 credit hours)

* Total tuition for program is approximately \$64,170

The estimated additional expenses for each dependent that requires F-2 or J-2 status are:

Spouse: \$5,200 per academic year (3 quarters/9 months)

Each Child: \$3,960 per academic year (3 quarters/9 months)

These funds can be proven in the form of bank documents, awards from the University of Denver, sponsorships outside the University, or any combination of these.

Please note:

- Only use funding that you will have access to during your program. The University cannot guarantee employment or funding outside that offered in your admission letter.

- The costs are for one academic year (3 quarters/9 months). If you remain in the U.S. through the summer quarter, you are responsible for any additional expenses, including tuition, fees, and books for summer classes you enroll in.
- These estimates assume a moderate lifestyle and do not include international travel.
- This document is not a coursework plan and does not guarantee you can complete your program in one academic year. Contact your academic advisor to make a coursework plan.
- This document is not a tuition bill. All costs are subject to change.
